# Welcome to NTU

# Frequently asked questions

#### Where and how do I register?

When you arrive, please register with our welcome staff in the Newton building (map ref N). The registration desk is open all day, and you can use express registration to beat the queues.

# Can I bring friends and family along?

Yes, you're welcome to bring guests. However, we may have to restrict numbers for some sessions; in these instances, we'll always give priority to students.

#### Do I need to arrive at 9 am?

You don't need to arrive for 9 am, but make sure you use the timetable to check when your subject talk begins. Use the handy planner provided to organise which sessions and activities you want to attend.

#### What should I bring with me?

We would suggest you bring:

- your express registration letter that came with this guide;
- this open day guide (you'll find a handy map at the back too);
- a plan of the talks and sessions you want to attend; and
- a list of questions for staff and current students.

Make sure you dress appropriately for the weather.

# Talks and Tours

#### Talks

Our talks will help you find out more about the subjects you want to study, and to get a taste of what it's like to be a student at NTU.

# Welcome talk

Delivered by a senior academic, the welcome talk will give you an introduction to NTU and your Academic School before you go onto a subject talk.

#### Taster sessions

Some of our courses will be offering taster sessions to give you a real insight into what it's like to study on your course.

# Accommodation talk

Find out about where you could be living and how to book with us, and hear the experiences of our students.

### Student finance talk

Going to university is a great investment in your future. The student finance talk will cover managing your money, paying your fees, and getting help with your finances.

### Advice for parents talk

This guided Q&A in an informal atmosphere will give you the opportunity to ask our Student Ambassadors any questions you have about supporting your child through university.

### What if some of your chosen talks clash?

Don't worry – just go along to the one you think is most important. You can then visit the Information Fair to find out what you missed and pick up course material.



#### **Facilities tours**

We'll be offering tours of our course-specific facilities. Check the open day timetable for details, or if you're unsure, just ask one of our staff members on the day.

#### Campus tours

Get a feel for the NTU City Campus by going on a student-led tour. The tours start at 9 am and continue throughout the day. They last around 40 minutes and start at the Newton building (map ref T).

#### Accommodation

Come and see what it's like to be a student living on campus. A selection of our halls of residence will be open, with staff and current students available to answer questions. You can also visit our accommodation stand at the Information Fair.

# Library and Learning Resources

At the heart of each campus, NTU has an excellent library and IT resource rooms designed to support student learning. You can drop in to the library between 9 am and 3.30 pm, and the library staff will be delighted to tell you about the services and facilities available.

# **Information Fair**

Whatever questions you might have about life at NTU, finding somewhere to live, or what comes after your studies, our Information Fair is here to help. It runs from 9 am to 3.30 pm in the Newton building (map ref N).

# Health and safety

### Road safety

Be extremely careful when crossing roads and use the crossing facilities provided. Please be aware of the trams passing through the City Campus.

### First aid

If you require first aid, please contact the main reception, security, or a member of staff.

### Fire safety

If you hear the fire alarm, leave the building by the nearest safe exit. Staff will show you the way. Do not use the lifts.

If you feel you would be unable to evacuate a building via the stairs, please use the disabled refuge points to make contact with staff. They are generally found in stairwells and common areas.

# Getting here

There are many advantages to studying in Nottingham, but one of the most important is its central location in the heart of England.

#### Travelling by car

The closest car parks to the City Campus are:

- Trinity Square (NG1 4BT) £4.30 − £13;
- Talbot Street (**NG1 5GG**) £1.80 − £12.50; or

However, we recommend you use the Park and Ride services as city centre parking is limited.

#### From the north, south or west

Nottingham has a new series of tram lines and Park and Rides. All trams pass the NTU stop.

You can visit **www.thetram.net** for full details, but your options will include the following.

- Leaving the M1 at J24, use Clifton South. The postcode is **NG11 8BF**, and the journey time to the University is 28 minutes.
- Leaving the M1 at J25, use Toton Lane. The postcode is **NG9 7JA**, and the journey time to the University is 38 minutes.
- Leaving the M1 at J26, you can use the Park and Rides at either Phoenix Park (postcode NG8 6AS, journey time 17 minutes) or Wilkinson Street (postcode NG7 7NU, journey time 12 minutes).

**Price:** £4 for an adult day ticket from one of the ticket machines, which do give change.

Parking is free. You must buy a ticket before you board the tram.\*

Frequency: Every seven minutes.

#### From the east

The Citylink 2 bus service operates from the Park and Ride in the grounds of Nottingham Racecourse, just off Colwick Loop Road.


# You can visit **www.nottinghamcity.gov.uk** */racecourseparkandride* for full details.

 From the A52, follow the signs to Nottingham, and then to the Racecourse Park and Ride. The postcode is NG2 4BE. The Citylink 2 bus will then drop you off on Lower Parliament Street (see map ref e on City centre map on the back cover of this booklet), and from there it's an eight-minute walk to the University (see map ref ? on City Campus map in the back of this guide). Head up Upper Parliament Street until you reach the Theatre Royal, then turn right and follow the tram tracks to our front door.

Frequency: Every 20 minutes.

# \*Better tram deal if more than one person is travelling.

At weekends you can buy an Off Peak Group ticket for  $\pm 5$ . This allows unlimited travel all day for two adults (over 16), plus three people under the age of 16. Children under five travel free.



### Travelling by rail

Nottingham train station is located near the city centre. Visit **www.nationalrail.co.uk** for timetables. Take the tram from the NET tram terminus next to the station heading towards Phoenix Park or Hucknall. It should take about ten minutes to reach the University.

**Price:** £4 for an adult day ticket from one of the ticket machines, which do give change. You must buy a ticket before you board the tram.\*

Frequency: Every seven minutes.
