





- Students with Tier 4 visas in the UK for longer than 6 months and their dependants (i.e. those who paid for the Immigration Health surcharge) access to UK NHS healthcare.
- ❖ The National Health Service provides healthcare for UK residents, including appointments with a doctor, hospital treatment, dental care and optical care.
- ❖ EU and EEA students: an EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) enables access to NHS care.
- ❖ Health insurance strongly recommended if studying less than 6 months.

#### **CHARGES**

There are some services and treatments that are carried out at an NHS hospital that are are free to everyone, including temporary visitors to the UK (e.g Accident & Emergency).

NHS charges apply to the following:

- ❖ Medicines prescribed by GP £9 per item
- ❖ Dental check up charges £22.70 register with NHS dentist: www.nhs.uk
- ❖ Optician charges vary £20-25
