


| HEALTHCARE IN THE UK

- ❖ Students with Tier 4 visas in the UK for longer than 6 months and their dependants (i.e. those who paid for the Immigration Health surcharge) access to UK NHS healthcare.
- The National Health Service provides healthcare for UK residents, including appointments with a doctor, hospital treatment, dental care and optical care.
- **EU and EEA students**: an **EHIC** (European Health Insurance Card) enables access to NHS care.
- ❖ Health insurance strongly recommended if studying less than 6 months.

CHARGES

There are some services and treatments that are carried out at an NHS hospital that are ar free to everyone, including temporary visitors to the UK (e.g Accident & Emergency).



- ❖ Medicines prescribed by GP £9 per item
- ❖ Dental check up charges £22.70 − register with NHS dentist: www.nhs.uk
- ❖ Optician charges vary £20-25

IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTS - ENROLMENT



ELIGIBILITY TO STUDY IN THE UK

- Non-EEA students are required to provide NTU with a copy of valid passport and visa to confirm you are eligible to study in the UK.
- You must do this as soon as possible. You cannot fully enrol until this is done.
- You must have a valid visa which permits you to study at NTU.
- Tier 4 visa must have been obtained using a CAS from NTU.
- ▲ Students who fail to provide documents by their deadline will be reported to UKVI and unable to continue their studies



COLLECT YOUR BIOMETRIC RESIDENCE PERMIT (BRP)

- Students applying to come to the UK for more than 6 months are given temporary visas
- You must collect their biometric residence permit on arrival.
- You should have either requested to collect their BRP from a local Post Office or the University.
- BRPs should be collected within 10 days of arriving in the UK.
 - ▲ You will need your BRP in order to complete enrolment!



BRP Collection from NTU:

You will receive an email from NTU when your BRP is ready to collect.


- Collection from international enrolment points, Newton building (City campus) – 20-27 September
- For collection outside these dates, email regtier4@ntu.ac.uk

BRP Collection from Post Office:

Check visa decision letter for details of Post Office location

BRING THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS TO YOUR COLLECTION POINT:

- 1. Your passport
- 2. Your visa decision letter from the UKVI.
- 3. Your full address in Nottingham including your postcode.





CHECK YOUR VISA IS CORRECT

- Students studying courses that are 12 months or longer
 - Visa length = duration of course + 4 months
- Students studying courses that are less than 12 months (but longer than 6 months) Visa length = duration of course + 2 months
- Check that all details on your visa are correct now and contact the International Student Support Service if you have any queries about your visa expiry date
 - ▲ Visa errors must be reported to UKVI within 10 days of your arrival in the UK







KEEP YOUR BRP SAFE!

- Keep your BRP card safe at all times when travelling or going out!
- Replacements cost £75.20 for standard applications (plus visa appointment costs)
- Applications for BRP replacements can take <u>8-10 weeks</u> to process
- You must apply for a replacement BRP within 3 months if your BRP was lost, stolen or damaged in the UK
- You should not make any travel plans if you've lost your BRP

REGISTERING WITH THE POLICE

Students from the following countries are required to register with the police within **7 days** of arrival in the UK

• You can register with the Police in the Newton Building in the Student Services Centre

▲ You must inform the police within 7 days of any change of address or other information.

Documents:

- Your passport
- 2 recent passport-sized pictures
- The registration fee of £34
- Letter from NTU (offer/visa letter) confirming your course details



TIER 4 RESPONSIBILITIES

STUDENT IMMIGRATION RESPONSIBILITIES

You are required to ensure that you have provided NTU with:

- Your up-to-date personal contact details, including a local term-time UK address, an out of term-time address (if different) and telephone numbers.
- You can **update your details online** from the NTU website click on Current Students > myNTU > Update your details
- You must provide NTU with a copy of your passport and visa. If you ever need to renew these documents, you must provide NTU with a copy of the new document as soon as you receive it.

You also need to ensure that you make all relevant tuition fee payments/provide NTU with details of your financial sponsorship.





TIER 4 RESPONSIBILITIES

NTU IMMIGRATION RESPONSIBILITIES

NTU will be required to report information to UKVI. We will be required to tell UKVI about students who:

- Have used a CAS from NTU in order to obtain a visa but do not enrol on the course by the deadline.
- Miss expected contacts with NTU without approved permission.
- Defer or take a break from studies for any reason.
- Change to a shorter course, or finish their studies early.
- Leave NTU without completing their course.

UKVI will curtail or cancel your visa if it is notified of one of these matters. Contact the International Student Support Services for advice.





TIER 4 RESPONSIBILITIES

WORKING DURING YOUR STUDIES

- Check your visa it includes information about your entitlement to work.
- Students on degree level courses can work <u>up to 20 hours a week</u> during term-time and full-time during holidays check when your official holidays are
- You can do most kinds of work, but you must not engage in business, be selfemployed, provide services as a professional sportsperson or entertainer, or fill a permanent full-time vacancy.
- Make sure you understand the work restrictions.
- Never work more hours than you are allowed to or in a job which you do not have permission to do.
- Employer may ask for confirmation of term dates from the University





TRAVELLING OUTSIDE OF THE UK (STUDY TRIPS/HOLIDAYS)

BEFORE YOU TRAVEL

- > Find out whether you need a visa to enter your country of destination.
- ➤ Information available on embassy's relevant website
- > Travelling to Europe Schengen visas, guidance notes/School talks
- > Minimum length of UK visa required after return, often 3 months
- > Minimum length of time required on passport after return, often 6 months







OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

Open a UK bank account to manage your money easily and pay rent, bills and daily expenses without extra charges.

BANKS NEAR NOTTINGHAM TRENT CITY CAMPUS

- All major banks are located in the City Centre.
- There is a **Santander** branch inside Newton Building, City Campus.
- Pick up a banking information leaflet from our Information Desk

WHAT YOU WILL NEED TO OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT

Requirements may vary from bank to bank. Typically, you will need:

- Proof of ID
 Your passport or your national ID (if you're from the EEA)
- Non-EEA students proof of your UK immigration status
 A valid visa/immigration document vignette in your passport or Biometric Residence Permit (BRP)
- Bank Letter (Letter of introduction for banking facilities for international students only You will need to request this letter from your School Office once you have selected which bank you will use. Separate letter for each bank.

* IMPORTANT – Keep your Bank Statements safe for visa extension applications or as proof of address!

☐ CYCLING

Hire a bike with lock and lights for just £39 for the whole academic year, plus £60 refundable deposit.

BUS

- Nottingham City Transport run buses in and around the city www.nctx.co.uk. A regular bus (Uni 4) service runs between Clifton and City, with stops right in the heart of the city centre.
- Top up your student card with NCT bus credit from NTU Student Support Service Desk

□TRAM

- The Nottingham Express Transit (NET) tram has stops near Nottingham Trent University and directly links NTU City Campus to Nottingham Station and City Centre: www.thetram.net

□ TAXIS

There are plenty of taxi ranks in town, mostly around Old Market Square or train station.



We recommend following these basic precautions to look after yourself and your belongings:

- Always lock your doors and windows
- Watch out how much you drink
- Register your belongings

- Keep personal details safe
- Be extra careful with money cash and online

Use the Safe Taxi Scheme – Nottingham Cars - if you have lost money or have no change for a taxi. Use your NTU card and book your taxi "Safe Taxi Scheme". Settle your bill at the Student Union reception the following day.
