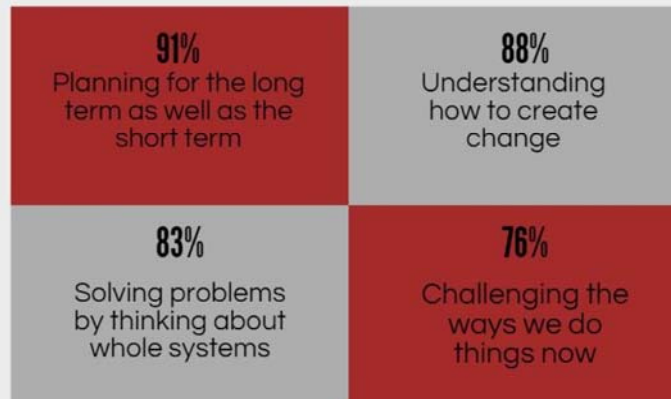
The NUS Uni Skills survey was conducted in February and March 2016 and aimed to investigate students' thoughts on where they study and their future employment

Which are the best ways to incorporate sustainability skills in courses?

There is a desire among students to re-frame existing curriculum content rather than adding new things

Placements and work experience	89%
Build sustainability material into the existing content in the course	74%
Link coursework or dissertations to sustainability issues	74%

51% would be willing to sacrifice £3000 from an average starting salary to get a job role that contributes to positive environmental and social change.



74% would be willing to sacrifice £1000 from an average starting salary to work for a company with a strong environmental and social record.

63% of the respondents agree with the statement "Being a student at my university / college encourages me to think and act to help the environment, and other people".

89% believe sustainable development should be actively incorporated and promoted by universities.

71% of students wants to learn more about sustainability
